

**JOINT INFORMATION PROCEEDINGS
TOWN COUNCIL AND BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING**

FEBRUARY 5, 2018

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council met in conjunction the Teton County Commission in a regular joint information session in the Council Chambers of Town Hall located at 150 East Pearl at 3:00 P.M. Upon roll call the following were found to be present:

Mayor & Council: Mayor Pete Muldoon, Jim Stanford, Hailey Morton Levinson, Bob Lenz, and Don Frank.

Chair & Commissioners: Chairman Mark Newcomb, Natalia Macker, Smokey Rhea, Paul Vogelheim, and Greg Epstein.

Consent Calendar. On behalf of the Town, a motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to approve item A as presented on the Consent Calendar. On behalf of the County, a motion was made by Paul Vogelheim and seconded by Natalia Macker to approve item A as presented on the Consent Calendar.

A. **Meeting Minutes.** To approve the January 8, 2018 regular joint meeting minutes as presented.

Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried on behalf of the Town. Chairman Newcomb called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried on behalf of the County.

Request for Critical Service Provider by Emerg+A+Care. Billi Jennings and April Norton made staff comment. Gale Crozier, a Physician's Assistant from Emerg+A+Care made comment.

On behalf of the Town, a motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Pete Muldoon to approve Emerg+A+Care as a Critical Services Provider organization and to approve Physician and Physician's Assistant as Critical Services Provider positions. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed 2-3 in favor with Stanford, Lenz, and Frank opposed. The motion failed on behalf of the Town.

The County did not make a motion.

Health in All Policies. Jodie Pond and Rachael Fuller provided a presentation on Health in All Policies (HiAP). HiAP is a framework that uses a collaborative approach to improve the health of a community by incorporating health, sustainability and health equity considerations into decision-making and policy decisions across sectors by acknowledging that the social determinants of health have a profound effect on the health of a community.

On behalf of the Town, a motion was made by Jim Stanford and seconded by Hailey Morton Levinson to approve the Public Health Department to move forward with Health in All Policies by creating a work group to develop recommendations on how to scale Health in All Policies in Teton County and the Town of Jackson. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote which showed all in favor and the motion carried.

On behalf of the County, a motion was made by Smokey Rhea and seconded by Greg Epstein to approve the Public Health Department to move forward with Health in All Policies by creating a work group to develop recommendations on how to scale Health in All Policies in Teton County and the Town of Jackson. Chairman Newcomb called for the vote which showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Appointment to the Natural Resources Stakeholder Group. Roby Hurley made staff comment on the need to select a new stakeholder member to replace a resigned member of this group who was working on the update of the Natural Resources Land Development Regulations.

On behalf of the County, a motion was made by Paul Vogelheim and seconded by Smokey Rhea to appoint Hank Phibbs as the Property Rights Advocate to serve on the Stakeholder Group for the Natural Resource LDRs Update until the Update is complete. Chairman Newcomb called for the vote which showed all in favor and the motion carried.

On behalf of the Town, a motion was made by Natalia Macker and seconded by Jim Stanford to appoint Hank Phibbs as the Property Rights Advocate to serve on the Stakeholder Group for the Natural Resource LDRs Update until the Update is complete. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote which showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Matters from Council, Commissioners, and Staff. Bob Lenz made comment on the Housing Authority's decision regarding an affordable housing owner and the appeal to the Board of County Commissioners. Erin Weisman and Audrey Cohen Davis made staff comment.

Jim Stanford made comment on a public meeting held by the Forest Service regarding camping on Forest Service land and the fire and human safety concerns that stemmed from that.

Adjourn. On behalf of the Town, a motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to adjourn. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried. On behalf of the County, a motion was made by Natalia Macker and seconded by Paul Vogelheim to adjourn. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 4:12 p.m.
