

**SPECIAL JOINT INFORMATION PROCEEDINGS
TOWN COUNCIL AND BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING**

MAY 16, 2018

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council and Teton County Commission met in conjunction with the Teton County School District #1 Board in the School Board Offices located at 1235 Gregory Lane at 3:05 p.m. The Special meeting was held as a periodic update between the three boards. Upon roll call the following were present:

TOWN COUNCIL: Bob Lenz and Mayor Pete Muldoon joined by telephone and left at 4:13 p.m. Jim Stanford, Don Frank, and Hailey Morton Levinson were absent and a quorum was not present.

COUNTY COMMISSION: Vice-Chair Natalia Macker, Paul Vogelheim, Greg Epstein, and Smokey Rhea. Mark Newcomb arrived at 3:10 p.m. and left at 4:27 p.m.

SCHOOL DISTRICT: Chair Kate Mead, Keith Gingery, Bill Scarlett, and Janine Bay Teske. Betsy Carlin arrived at 3:14 p.m. and Annie Band arrived at 3:45 p.m. Joe Larrow was absent.

OTHERS PRESENT AND STAFFING: Bob McLaurin, Larry Pardee, Audrey Cohen-Davis, Tyler Sinclair, Darren Brugmann, Sandy Birdyshaw, Sherry Daigle, Erin Weisman, Alyssa Watkins, Steve Ashworth, Sara Van Genderen Attorney, Dr. Gillian Chapman Superintendent, and Jeff Daugherty Assistant Superintendent of Operations. State Representative Mike Gierau. Melissa Turley.

Capacity Presentation. Dr. Chapman and Mr. Daugherty provided information on Teton County school enrollment projects versus actual enrollment numbers, the Success 2022 goal, the enrollment boundary decision made in June 2011 which includes only Teton County residents, a Sixth Grade wing expansion at the middle school, expansion opportunities identified at Jackson Hole High School (JHHS), that JHHS had been ranked as Number One in the State of Wyoming by the U.S. News and World Report, adding a Career Tech or 'life ready' curriculum to JHHS for students to learn trades, and adding an indoor training facility at the track field.

Transfer Village Parcel. Dr. Chapman and Mr. Daugherty provided information on a proposed site plan, funding options, and purpose of a village school site. While the proposal had been presented to the School Board, no decisions have been made on moving forward. Discussion followed.

Transportation plan to Ease Traffic on Sidewalks and Bus Routes. Dr. Chapman stated the sidewalk radius around Jackson Elementary had been extended to a one mile radius. The School Board requested assistance from the Town and County for sidewalk improvements on Rancher Street, Cache Street, and on Gregory Lane. Mayor Muldoon left the meeting at 4:13 p.m.

Bus Shelters. Dr. Chapman and Mr. Daugherty made comment on establishing START bus stops near Munger Mountain School, constructing three additional bus shelters at a cost of \$70,000. Darren Brugmann commented on grant funding requests for the shelters.

Easement under the Concession Stand at the Athletic Field. Bob McLaurin commented on the sewer line for the concession building and need for an easement for the encroachment. Chairman Newcomb left the meeting at 4:27 p.m.

Other matters for discussion. Mr. Gingery presented a book called "Towers Falling" to the elected officials and commented on the program One Book One Read One Community with the Library. He encouraged that the book be read over the summer and for participation in the fall with the fifth and sixth graders.

On behalf of the County, a motion was made by Paul Vogelheim and seconded by Greg Epstein to adjourn. The motion showed all in favor and carried unanimously. The Town did not have a quorum present. The School Board adjourned by unanimous vote. The meeting adjourned at 4:44 p.m.
