

**OFFICIAL SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF
COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, TETON COUNTY, WYOMING**

The Teton County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on **July 2, 2018** in the Commissioners Chambers located at 200 S. Willow in Jackson. The meeting was called to order at 9:10am.

Commission present: Mark Newcomb Chair, Natalia Macker Vice-Chair, Greg Epstein, Smokey Rhea, and Paul Vogelheim.

ADOPT AGENDA

A motion was made by Commissioner Macker and seconded by Commissioner Vogelheim to adopt today's agenda as presented with the following changes:

Chair Newcomb called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.
