



Teton County Integrated Solid Waste and Recycling Community Partnership Guidelines 2023

Deadline: February 17, 2023

Road to Zero Waste JH Community Partnerships is a project of Teton County Integrated Solid Waste and Recycling (ISWR) aimed at reducing Jackson Hole's consumption of resources and landfill bound waste through a creative educational and outreach campaign. The campaign focuses on residents and businesses alike, promoting a less wasteful and more sustainable community. The project has been a multifaceted effort; introducing and promoting new ideas to enhance the efficiency and sustainability of our everyday community habits.

In 2023, Teton County ISWR will offer a total of \$10,000 to organizations interested in promoting Zero Waste through their own educational and outreach efforts. To be considered for a partnership, please submit a proposal explaining your organization's project idea, including the following:

- Organization's Mission Statement;
- Summary of the Project (*60 words*);
- Explanation of Community Need (*250 words*);
- Project Description (*500 words*) – Specify how your project will reflect and promote the Zero Waste campaign;
- Anticipated Community Impact (*250 words*);
- Evaluation strategies your organization intends to employ (*250 words*); and,
- Project Budget – including any direct and in-kind match.

Teton County ISWR will select three to five organizations with an award cap of \$4,5000. **Non-profits only please! Proposals must be received by February 17, 2023.** The funding period will begin April 1, 2023 and conclude November 30, 2023. As part of the Road to Zero Waste JH Community Partnership, you will be required to submit a Final Report to Teton County Integrated Solid Waste and Recycling (ISWR) on or before November 30, 2023. Final Report requirements will be identified during the award process.
