Open Fire Rules



You must call Dispatch (733-2331) every day of your open burn.

- Pile cannot exceed 1000 cubic feet. Materials containing paints, resins, glues, stains, or other manufactured coating or bonding material shall not be burned.
- Fire must be attended at all times. When available, provide cell phone contact number to Dispatch. IFC 307.5
- Fire must be 50' from all combustibles (buildings, cars, vegetation, etc).
- Water, fire extinguisher, dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or other on-site fire-extinguishing equipment must be available.
- Fire must be extinguished with gusty or strong winds.

Open Fire Rules



You must call Dispatch (733-2331) every day of your open burn.

- Open burning can only be conducted during Burn Week; usually in May and November. Town of Jackson Ordinance
- Fire must be 50' from all combustibles (buildings, cars, vegetation, etc).
- Pile cannot exceed 1000 cubic feet. Materials containing paints, resins, glues, stains, or other manufactured coating or bonding material shall not be burned.
- Fire must be constantly attended. Water, fire extinguisher, dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or other on-site fire-extinguishing equipment must be available.
- Fire must be extinguished with gusty or strong winds.

Open Burning: The burning of materials wherein products of combustion are emitted directly into the ambient air without passing through a stack or chimney from an enclosed chamber. Open burning does not include road flares, smudgepots and similar devices associated with safety or occupational uses typically considered open flames, recreational fires, or use of portable outdoor fireplaces. For the purpose of this definition, a chamber shall be regarded as enclosed when, during the time combustion occurs, only apertures, ducts, stacks, flues or chimneys necessary to provide combustion air and permit the escape of exhaust gas are open.

Open burning fires may be prohibited when conditions make such fires hazardous.

Rules referenced include both local ordinance and conditions of the International Fire Code.
