Recreational Fire Rules

- Pile cannot exceed 3' wide by 2' tall (becomes an open burn).
- Fire must be 25' from all combustibles (buildings, cars, vegetation).
- Fire must be constantly attended. Water, fire extinguisher, dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or other on-site fire-extinguishing equipment must be available.
- Fire must be extinguished with gusty or strong winds.

Recreational Fire Rules

- Listed portable outdoor fireplaces, used in accordance with manufacturer's instructions shall not be operated within 15 feet of a structure or combustible material.
- Fire must be a minimum of 15' from all combustibles (building, cars, vegetation, etc.).
- Fire must be constantly attended. Water, fire extinguisher, dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or other on-site fire-extinguishing equipment must be available.
- Fire must be extinguished with gusty or strong winds.

Recreational Fire: An outdoor fire burning materials other than rubbish where the fuel being burned is not considered an incinerator, outdoor fireplace, portable outdoor fireplace, barbeque grill or barbeque pit and has a total fuel are of 3' or less in diameter and 2' or less in height for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth or similar purposes.

Portable Outdoor Fireplace: A portable, outdoor, solid fuel burning fireplace that may be constructed of steel, concrete, clay or other noncombustible material. A portable outdoor fireplace may be open in design, or may be equipped with a small hearth opening and short chimney or chimney opening in the top.

Recreational fires may be prohibited when conditions make such fires hazardous 2024 International Fire Code References

Rules referenced include both local ordinance and conditions of the International Fire Code.
