

STATEMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES ORGANIZATION

Supporting or Opposing Ballot Proposition, Initiative, or Referendum Petition Drive
W.S. 22-25-106(b)

(IMPORTANT! This form is for organizations formed at the county or municipal level to support or oppose a local ballot proposition, an initiative or referendum petition drive.)

Who must file?

Any organization supporting or opposing a ballot proposition, an initiative or referendum petition drive.

What must be filed and when?

- A fully itemized campaign report must be filed within the *filing deadlines* specified below.
- Organizations are prohibited from contributing to candidates or candidate committees, but may contribute to PACs or political parties or support or oppose ballot propositions or initiative or referendum petition drives.
- Organizations may receive contributions from corporations, partnerships, etc.

Where do I file?

What are the deadline dates for the 2026 election?

- **If the ballot proposition appears on the General Election Ballot:**
 - Contributions and Expenditures – 7 days before the General Election:
 - **Oct. 27, 2026**
- **If the ballot proposition appears on the ballot at any other election:**
 - Contributions and Expenditures – 7 days before the election.
- **Organizations supporting/opposing a local initiative or referendum petition drive:**
 - Contributions and Expenditures – 7 days before the General Election:
 - **Oct. 27, 2026**

Reporting requirements:

The general rule is that an organization should note and keep track of all campaign contributions no matter how small. The law only requires you to itemize on this form contributions totaling \$100 or more. However, please keep in mind that if you receive \$80 from a contributor who later gives you \$30, you must report the total \$110 contribution on this form.

Penalty for not reporting:

A person found guilty of violating Wyoming campaign finance statutes is subject to criminal charges. Failure to file a civil penalty of up to two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per day.

Contributions – Individuals

(Contributions from corporations, unions, partnerships, and associations are prohibited.)

Contributions from sole proprietorships are legal, but must be identified as such.)

Contributions – Corporations, Organizations, Associations, etc.

These groups are prohibited from making contributions to candidates and political parties. However, these groups may make contributions to support or oppose a ballot proposition or an initiative or referendum petition drive.

Anonymous contributions are those contributions whose origins cannot be determined, i.e., “pass the hat” contributions. **An anonymous contribution does not mean a contributor may donate to the candidate or PAC with the understanding the contributor’s name will not be reported.**
